More Than A Score: Language and Communication Assessment in Minimally Verbal and Pre-Verbal Students Vicki Clarke, MS, CCC-SLP

Standardized language tests for our minimally verbal students often result in dismal scores that don't accurately reflect our students' skills and knowledge. A standard score of "Less than 55" does little to help us understand a child's language skills. We still have to be able to clearly describe a child's current level of communication and language functioning so that we can target appropriate goals and show progress. How do we accurately assess language and communication skills when we can't sit down at a table, present picture cards, and expect a succinct spoken response to our questions? Come join the discussion as we troubleshoot the communication and language assessment process for our early communicators and AAC users. We will explore tools that allow us to measure even the earliest communication skills through formal testing, watching, and listening. With video examples, discussion, and exploration of tools, we will develop a plan of action for assessing your most communicatively challenged students' communication and language skills.

Objectives:

Participants will be able to describe the value and use of standardized test instruments for minimally verbal students. • Participants will be able to identify several tools for assessing language and communication skills in minimally verbal or non-verbal students. • Participants will be able to identify a hierarchy of communication skills from pre intentional communication to formal language use. • Participants will be able to identify 4 basic functions of communication.

Achieving Authentic Communication: Implementation Tool Kit Cortney Maholz, MA, CCC-SLP

This course will review elements of implementation to help participants achieve authentic communication with their clients. Participants will learn about communication, a complex multimodal process, involving the interaction of three elements: functions of communication, the environment, and communication partners. This will include a discussion about how to move beyond requesting and what to do as the communication partner. Additionally, participants will learn about the importance of creating communication opportunities, and how to do so for their clients. Examples will be used throughout the seminar and participants will have hands on experience using several tools to help clients achieve authentic communication.

Objectives

Participants will identify functions of communication. • Participants will define authentic communication. • Participants will identify communication partners and their roles. • Participants will define a communication opportunity. • Participants will analyze the environment and identify how to create communication opportunities.
